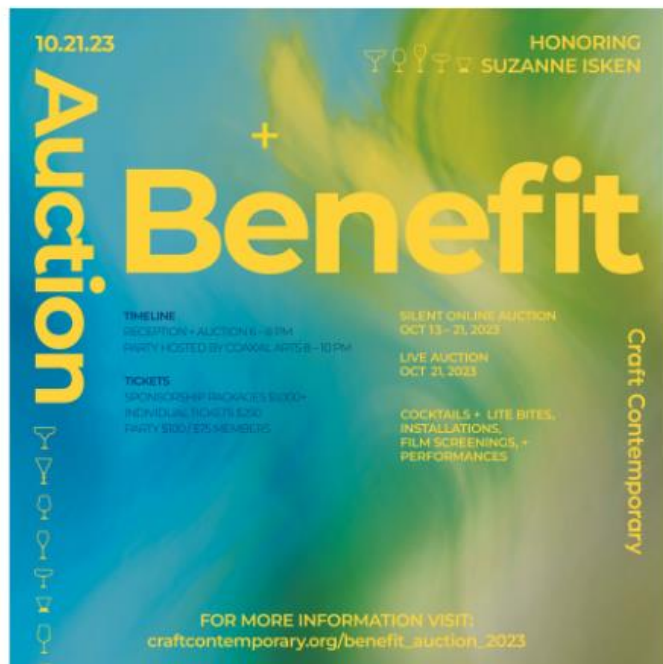

About the Honoree:

Suzanne Isken joined Craft Contemporary in February 2011 where she has led initiatives to support the creation of contemporary craft and build audiences by developing a sizeable program of hands-on experiences for the public. In 2019 Isken led the Board of Directors in an initiative that renamed the museum, formerly known as the Craft & Folk Art Museum, as Craft Contemporary. Under her direction, the museum has presented landmark exhibitions including *This is Not a Silent Movie: Four Contemporary Alaska Native Artists*, *Betye Saar: Keepin' it Clean*, *Man-Made: Contemporary Male Quilters*, *The US-Mexico Border: Place, Imagination and Possibility*, and *Strings of Desire*. Previously she served as the Director of Education for ten years at The Museum of Contemporary Art, following 10 years of service as coordinator of school and teacher programs and gallery educator. She attended the Getty Leadership Program in 2008. Awards include recognition as the 2004 Pacific Region Art Educator of the Year by the National Art Education Association.

About Coaxial Arts Foundation

Coaxial Arts Foundation is a 501(c)3 non-profit, multi-disciplinary media arts organization devoted to media, sound, and performance art. Our mission is to facilitate a collective of artists that supports the community at large by running an art space where one can experience new

work of experimental video, sound, and performance art under one roof. Started by artists for artists, Coaxial functions on a fundamental principle: to support working artists within an essential framework to promote and generate new works. By providing a range of services to underground artists, we are able to provide a space for artists to create, experiment, and explore topics that are often overlooked and seen as transgressive. We are one of the few organizations in Los Angeles that explicitly supports the creation of and presents video art and new multimedia works. In this position, we serve as a central hub for the community of artists dedicated to this type of production. Since opening our brick and mortar in 2015, Coaxial has provided numerous residencies, studio space, technical support, and public exhibition space to showcase underground artists. We focus on making and providing a space/forum for the creation of new projects, and further experimenting and pushing what art is and its purpose.

Performers

Matías Anaya (she/her) is a Los Angeles based transfeminine musical powerhouse. As a multi-instrumentalist and producer of Peruvian and Uruguayan ancestry, she composes queer Latinx music in a plethora of genres - from cumbia and merengue to punk and house.

Lu Coy (they/them) is a queer mixed media artist and musician based in Los Angeles, California. Originally from Southwest Texas, Lu is of Mexican and Ukrainian Jewish heritage and creates music which ranges from complex electronic soundscapes to dark, deeply confessional acoustic songs. With their introspective and ritualistic performances, Coy guides their audiences through the fading architectures of ancestral, transcestral and personal memory to salvage the forms of the dead and heal moments of personal loss and failure.
