IAO Olfactory Storylab Maker-in-Residence

LOS ANGELES- IAO Olfactory Storylab: Maker-in-Residence is Craft Contemporary's first scent-based residency program featuring The Institute for Art and Olfaction as the Maker-in-Residence. As the Craft Contemporary Maker-in-Residence, The Institute for Art and Olfaction will introduce visitors to the rich creative possibilities of scent and craft facilitated by a curated group of visiting perfumers. Their project, IAO Olfactory Storylab, is an onsite perfume laboratory featuring an organ of perfume materials in appropriate solutions. Every Saturday between 11 am and 5 pm, the perfumers will work in the museum's lobby to create an olfactory sketch that relates to a myth from their culture or in response to a piece in the museum. As part of the residency program, the perfumers will also provide a short text explaining their work. The collaborative project will eventually make up a collection of 12 aromatic interpretations that will remain on display at Craft Contemporary for the duration of the residency, and subsequently at The Institute for Art and Olfaction.

"The perfumers participating in the Maker-in-Residence program reflect the diversity of the Los Angeles community and bring their unique cultural and intellectual heritage to the task of interpreting story with smell," says Julianne Lee, Director of Projects at the Institute for Art and Olfaction. IAO founder Saskia Wilson-Brown adds: "The IAO team is delighted to stand behind this roster of talented people in presenting perfumery for what it is: a heterogeneous, vibrant, and ever-evolving artform."

Participating perfumers include Dana El Masri (Jazmin Saraï), Daniel Krasofski (IAO), Debbie Lin and Na-Moya Lawrence (SAMAR), Joe Merrell (The Eyes Are Always There), Julianne Lee (IAO), L'lia 'Tizzle' Thomas (Aromakaura), Maxwell Williams (UFO Parfums), Minetta Rogers (IAO), Miss Layla (fūm fragrances), Persephenie (Persephenie Botanicals), Saskia Wilson-Brown (IAO), Terry Carter (Travertine Atelier).

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Beginning in June 2025, Craft Contemporary will present a series of exhibitions and will invite makers through its residency program to interpret the varied interactions between craft and the natural elements: air, water, earth, and fire. IAO Olfactory Storylab is the first of these residencies and will explore the ethereal qualities of air and its relations to scent and memory. IAO Olfactory Storylab Maker-in-Residence and the exhibitions and residents to follow will highlight sustainability, accessibility, and connect visitors to the universal rhythms of the Earth.

Significantly, these exhibitions will tell a new story of Craft in a contemporary world as we work together to heal global wounds through creativity and making.

ABOUT THE INSTITUTE OF ART AND OLFACTION

Founded in September 2012 in Los Angeles by Saskia Wilson-Brown, The Institute for Art and Olfaction (IAO) is a 501(c)3 non-profit devoted to advancing public access to scent. The organization opened its first public location in downtown Los Angeles in February 2013 before moving to its current location in Los Angeles' Chinatown in 2015.

The IAO fulfills its mission by initiating and supporting experimental projects with scent, providing accessible education in its laboratory and through partnerships with institutions and community groups, curating art exhibitions that incorporate scent in its gallery, and raising visibility for independent, artisan, experimental, and artistic practices with scent as a whole. Through these efforts, the IAO extends the world of scent beyond its traditional boundaries of appreciation and use.

In April 2014, the IAO held the first annual Art and Olfaction Awards, a yearly awards mechanism designed to help celebrate excellence in independent and artisan perfumery. This important international event has since been held in Los Angeles, Berlin, London, Amsterdam, and Lisbon.

Since its inception, the IAO has partnered with global institutions and has launched several initiatives including Scent Week, Experimental Scent Summit (in partnership with Smell Lab, Berlin), Scent Fair LA (with Darin Klein and Craft Contemporary), the IAO Gallery, IAO Library, and many others.

Currently, the IAO is helmed by Executive Director Saskia Wilson-Brown, Co-Directors Minetta Rogers and Julianne Lee, Lab Manager Daniel Krasofski, Library Curator Charles Rosenberg and the larger community of volunteers and friends.
